LEAVE NO ONE BEHIND - COMMUNITY DIALOGUE

AFRICA UNITED NATIONS YOUTH DELE-GATES PROGRAM - REGIONAL TRAINING 2

Empowering African Youth Advocates:

The Africa United Nations Youth Delegates Regional Training 2 recently took place in Nairobi, Kenya, bringing together an enthusiastic group of youth delegates from Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, Ethiopia, South Sudan, and Sudan. VNR - Community Dialogue in Makueni, Nyeri and Malindi



High-Level Political Forum: 8th- 18th July

The 2024 High-Level Political Forum (HLPF) is a pivotal event for global sustainable development, scheduled to take place in New York in July. This Forum serves as the United Nations' central platform for reviewing and following up on the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The 2024 HLPF will
