

UPDATES ON ICPD+25

The SDGs Kenya Forum has been contributing to the planning and influencing the agenda of the upcoming Nairobi summit as a member of the local reference group. Composed of UN Agencies, diplomatic missions and NGOs, the local reference group provides a space for UNFPA to share updates on the global planning of the summit. The group also provides space for partners to share feedback on various components and foster synergy on various moving parts. Additionally, the reference group has included an opportunity to link up with the national government planning process.

Revised Nairobi Commitments for Comments

A revised version of the Nairobi commitments has been issued following wide-ranging consultations.

The draft "Nairobi commitments" provide a framework to guide the development of specific national and local commitments by government bodies, civil society organizations, businesses and others with the aim of completing the work outlined in the ICPD Programme of Action.
