BACKGROUND

Was founded after the official launch of the SDGs here in Kenya after the realization that:

- There wasn't a proper mechanism for the engagement of young people in the implementation of SDGs
- Kenya and Africa at large are young considering the high percentage of young cohorts compared to the older generation
- Failure to implement the SDGs to the latter will have significant socio-economic and political impact on the current younger generation compared to the older generation
- The youth have innovative and bankable ideas hence must have a seat on the decision making table
- Rural youth are not or underrepresented in the implementation of SDGs
- Youth are best positioned to drive innovation agenda in SDG work



OBJECTIVES

- To advocate for sectoral implementation strategies and mechanisms that take into account the unique needs of the youth
- To ensure the youth are part of the decision making processes as far as the implementation of SDGs are concerned

- To ensure implementation strategies are flexible enough to accommodate ideas and suggestions from the youth
- To ensure the youth take active roles in the designing and implementation of programmes and projects aimed at meeting the targets of SDGs
- To provide youth a platform for empowerment to engage in SDG implementation.

- **4. Governance Youth are present and future leaders.** We advocate for Accountability and Transparency– SDG 5, 10, 12, 16,
